IX. PROJECT NARRATIVE

A. Specific problem to be addressed or improvements to be financed.

As a community which is contiguous to our host community – Plains Township, Bear Creek Township has seen a significant increase in traffic on our roadways. For Mohegan Sun customers traveling from the south or southeast into Luzerne County, State Route 115 is a conduit from the Pennsylvania Turnpike to the casino. Evidence of this is the year-long effort recently undertaken to place a traffic signal at the intersection of the turnpike (Route 476) and State Route 115. Unfortunately this increase in traffic has made traveling on Route 115 more dangerous, resulting in increased motor vehicle accidents, and placed additional burdens on our Volunteer Hose Company.

In addition to Bear Creek Township, the Bear Creek Township Volunteer Hose Company is the primary responder for both Bear Creek Borough and Buck Township. In addition, large portions of the Pennsylvania Turnpike, State Route 115, State Route 315, and Interstate 81 are in their primary or mutual aid coverage area.

To improve public safety, the Bear Creek Township Volunteer Hose Company needs to replace its fast-response vehicle.

B. Project Description.

Fire departments utilize various vehicles in order to respond to emergencies. The Bear Creek Township Volunteer Hose Company's quick response vehicle is a 1987 Emergency One rescue pumper. This vehicle is in such disrepair that it will not even pass a state inspection. The unavailability of this vehicle is even more problematic with the increase in motor vehicle incidents on State Route 115. To ensure the fastest possible response to emergency situations including automobile accidents, the Bear Creek Township Volunteer Hose Company seeks funding to purchase a GMC 5500 Mini Pumper (proposal attached).

C. Project Schedule and Key Milestone Dates.

The Bear Creek Volunteer Hose Company has already obtained a proposal for the purchase of its new Mini Pumper. Per that proposal, delivery is to be made within approximately 300 calendar days from the receipt of a contract by the manufacturer. The following summarizes the anticipated key dates and schedule.

To Whom It May Concern;

First, allow me to say how much The Bear Creek Volunteer Hose Company appreciates being allowed to apply for a grant. This grant is something that makes improving the welfare of Bear Creek and surrounding communities a possibility. Without it, I'm not sure how we'd handle the problem we currently have. Since we are such a small community department, we do not have the funds to replace the truck I describe in the following paragraphs. Years in and years out, it seems our donations stay the same, yet our bills keep rising. That is why I hope that you consider this grant as a possibility.

Our fire department is called upon for approximately 275 calls per year. Approximately 80% of these calls are motor vehicle crashes. These 275 calls do not include being dispatched to surrounding communities for what the fire service calls "mutual aid." We will be automatically dispatched to respond to a surrounding community to provide support due to lack of manpower or resources. The majority of our mutual aid calls also deal with motor vehicle crashes. Bear Creek is lucky enough to have hydraulic extrication tools that are relied upon to service surrounding communities in crashes where people are entrapped in their vehicles.

Through years of serving Bear Creek, as well as these surrounding communities, we've formed great relationships in times of misfortune and tragedy. Recently though, the truck we use to service these communities had to be taken out of service due to it being unsafe and not being able to pass state inspection. It is a 1987 Emergency One rescue pumper that has seen 21 years of service in the worst conditions. Time and corrosion have taken their toll on this truck no matter how well it was maintained. Also, it no longer meets requirements for the fire/rescue service. This is no more evident than the open riding positions in the rear of the cab for three personnel. New trucks are required to have enclosed cabs in the event of a rollover; personnel will not be ejected from the vehicle.

I have enclosed pictures of our 1987 rescue/pumper to show the unfortunate state it is in and to display the things I've mentioned above about the open riding position and the corrosion that 21 years of service have subjected it to. As I stated earlier, this is the truck that is used for the majority of service calls that we respond to. Large portions of the PA Turnpike, State Rt. 115, State Rt. 315, as well as Interstate 81 are in our primary or mutual aid coverage area for this truck's response:

I've also enclosed specifications for a truck that would sufficiently replace out 1987 rescue/pumper. The Bear Creek Volunteer Hose Company sat down with a representative from KME Fire Apparatus to relay our needs as a major service provider for motor vehicle crashes and interstate fire suppression for many communities. We believe this truck would not only serve our needs as a replacement, but would also allow us to serve more safely and efficiently. This truck would have more traffic warning signals on it which is probably the biggest hazard we face working on major highways. The older truck has none of the traffic warning signals that are standard on all of today's equipment.

Most volunteer departments have problems recruiting people willing to sacrifice so much of their time and effort and not be rewarded with money. The Bear creek Volunteer Hose Company does not have a problem with a lack of volunteers. Our problem is funding. It is unfortunate that we have so many highly trained, motivated, and determined volunteers, yet don't have the funds to give them the resources necessary to do their jobs. It is because of this that I, again, appreciate any help that you may be able to offer. All we want to do is the job that allows us to help complete strangers, in the most hazardous environments, for no pay or recognition. I know it sounds strange . . . but it's the truth. Thank you.
